

State and Community Energy Programs (Illinois)



- Provided \$15.4 million to support energy programs across the state.
- Impacted 12,650 people through energy efficiency installations and through the offering of workshops, webinars, trainings and outreach events to educate and impact more people.
- Helped create and/or retain 1,228 jobs.

Energy Futures Grant

- \$27 million in federal funding was granted to support and help scale local strategies that increase resiliency and improve access to affordable clean energy.
- Projects are led by communities and have equitable program innovation and scalable outcomes including:
 - > Energy affordability
 - > Energy access
 - > Strengthening community resilience
 - > Transportation and building electrification
 - > Clean energy microgrid
 - > Solar developments in disadvantaged communities
 - > Local engagement for an equitable energy transition
- Two projects awarded in Illinois:
 - > City of Carbondale
 - > City of Broadview



Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)



• Provides federally funded initiatives that help families reduce the costs associated with home energy bills, energy crises, weatherization and minor energy-related home repairs.




• Financial help is based on four criteria: income, household size, fuel type and geographic location.



 Community Action Agencies can pair residents with the local administering agency for LIHEAP and Weatherization programs.





Illinois Home Weatherization Assistance Program (IHWAP)



- Helps low-income residential customers reduce energy costs.
 - > Makes homes and apartments more energy-efficient.
 - > Can also include health and safety upgrades in the home.
- IHWAP funds various weatherization services.
 - Air sealing
 - > Attic and wall insulation
 - > HVAC repair or replacement
 - > Water heater repair or replacement
 - > Lighting and refrigerator replacement (electric base load reduction)
 - > Ventilation and moisture control
 - > Other health and safety measures

 - > Switch from propane to electric fuel source.

 Offers scholarships to students at seven community colleges.



• Fully funds internships for partner organizations across the Ameren Illinois service territory.




